HOW WE WORK

The Southwest Collective consists of several breakout groups that focus on specific issues:

- Small Business Support
- Family Support
- Civic Engagement
- Green Spaces
- Cycling Advocacy
- Advisory Board

Each group has a point person that provides a monthly progress update to the full Collective; the Advisory Board provides additional guidance to the Board of Directors on subjects and issues specific to the community.

The Collective meets virtually on the second Saturday of the month from 2-3pm. Those interested in attending can reach out to info@swcollective.org to receive the dial-in credentials.

At this monthly meeting, we provide updates by group, vote on new business and address any new concerns or initiatives.

We also use this time to determine where we should apply our "people power" to support a grassroots movement.

FAQ

Who can get involved?

Anyone who lives, works or owns property in the Midway area, and wants to see improvements.

Is this group affiliated with any political org?

No. We are nonpartisan. While we may work with current pols or candidates on an issue, we do not endorse anyone or allow solicitation at our meetings.

How long has this group been established?

We were founded in March of 2019.

Is there a board?

Yes. There is a nine-person board that meets monthly, prior to the general meeting that's open to the public.

Is the group bilingual?

Yes. Several members are bilingual in English/Spanish, and are happy to help translate.

Are there membership fees or donations required?

Right now, no. We don't need much in terms of funding. However, this may change as we incur costs for community events such as Freebies for Families. Currently, the board covers any costs out of their own pockets, as an investment in the community. You may make a tax-deductible donation any time at swcollective.org.
